Contents

Social changes in Europe, increasing divorce rates and the mobility of persons are some of the reasons for challenges facing international family law. New legal acts at the national, European and international level are the consequence.

The main source of law for cross-border divorces and parental responsibility is the Brussels II bis Regulation; its impact and application in the Member States as well as its interaction with the Hague Conventions will be explained.

Legal practitioners and academics in the field of family law will report on the current situation in the Member States with a special focus on divorce and its consequences for the custody of children. The recognition of formalised same-sex relationships in Europe will also be on the agenda. The exchange of practical experiences and an intensive debate on these issues will follow.

Another subject will be the Hague Convention on the international protection of adults, which was created due to the increasing need to provide for the protection in international situations of adults who, by reason of an impairment or insufficiency of their personal faculties, are not in a position to protect their interests, and which has already been ratified by the United Kingdom and Germany.

Finally, the opportunities for and limitations to crossborder mediation in family matters and the state of play of the future legal acts on family law and the law of successions will be presented.
