Patent information specialist

The collection and retrieval of patent publications is a critical component of the company's intellectual property strategy and, quite suitably, becomes work done by a specialist. Within many organisations, patent information specialists have the responsibility for determining how patent information is best made available and how it's best used within their organisations in a strategic manner.

In addition to technical literature, books and conferences/seminars, patents are a very important source of information for managers, scientists and technicians involved in research, development and in bringing forward new products and processes. Indeed 80% of what is published in patents isn't published elsewhere.

Successful innovation is thus inseparable from the proper use of patent information, both concerning the legal-patent aspects as well as the technical-scientific aspects of the innovation process. However, the use of patent information is often far from optimal for the following reasons:

- The lack of knowledge with the material, on one hand with the scope/meaning of the protection rights and on the other hand with the accessibility and retrievability of necessary information
- Patent accessibility is very specific and deviates substantially from other kinds of publications
- The technical-legal language in patent publications isn't aimed generally at disclosing scientific information.

Dutch based GO opleidingen organizes a training program in which these challenges will be addressed. The training is organised under auspices of the Dutch Patent Information User Group (WON).

WON

WON was founded in 1977 as an association with the purpose to provide a close contact between the users of patent information. The meetings of WON are also a forum and a place to exchange knowledge for patent information specialists. For more information: www.won-nl.org

Training and refesher courses

The Patent information specialist training consist of four modules which can also be followed as refresher courses. The training will provide students with a solid knowledge of patent information in general, however, particular attention is given to patent searches, legal aspects, the accessibility and retrieval of patent information.

Training structure and site

The training starts October 6th and is offered over 15 days, divided over 4 weeks, with an additional 7 to 10 hours of study required per week.

GO opleidingen offers 5 specific components as refresher courses:

- Module 1: Patent legal aspects and patent legislation
- Module 2a: Patent documents and their accessibility
- Module 2b: Patent classification
- Module 3: Retrieval and distribution of patent literature
- Module 4: Approaches for several kinds of patent searches

The training sessions are held in our dedicated training center in The Hague (Netherlands).

All lessons will be presented in the English language.

Admission requirements

You will need a bachelor degree in a technical-scientific discipline. During the training there is frequent use of the Internet. Participants are expected to have some experience of this medium.

Examination

The training concludes with an examination that's overseen by the exchange examining board of GO opleidingen. Candidates who pass the examination will receive an official certificate, registered with a governing body, Stichting Post-HBO in the Netherlands.

Registration

The training fee is € 5.690 (no VAT will be added). You may register with the form on the back of this brochure.

Cancellations should be made in writing but those occurring less than 28 days before the event will be charged the full fee, however a substitute participant will be welcomed.
