A BILL

To amend the Communications Act of 1934 to require schools and libraries that receive universal service support for discounted telecommunications services to establish policies governing access to material that is inappropriate for children.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,

SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE. →

This Act may be cited as the `E-Rate Policy and Child Protection Act of 1998'.

SEC. 2. SUPERVISION POLICIES REQUIRED. →

Section 254 of the Communications Act of 1934 (47 U.S.C. 254) is amended by adding at the end the following new subsection:

- `(I) Supervision Policies Required-
- `(1) POLICY STATEMENT- An elementary or secondary school or library that obtains services or preferential rates or treatment under this section shall establish a policy with

respect to access to material that is inappropriate for children.

`(2) CONTINUED ELIGIBILITY CONDITIONED ON STATEMENT- After January 1, 1999, an elementary or secondary school or library may not continue to be eligible to obtain services or preferential rates or treatment under this section unless such school or library has filed with the Commission, or an entity designated by the Commission, a statement describing the policy required by paragraph (1).'.
