Interpretation

2.InthisAct,

(*a*)"appearanceofaproduct"includesareferencetothepackaging,shape,colouror othernon -functionalcharacteristicfeaturesoftheproduct;

(b)" businessidentifier"includesbusinesssymbols, emblems, logosandslogansused by an enterprise to convey in the course of industrial or commercial activities, a certain identity with respect to the enterprise and the products produced or the services rendered by that enterprise;

(c) "dilution of good will or reputation" means the less ening of the

(i) distinctive character or advertising value of a trademark, tradename or other business identifier;

(ii)appearanceofaproductorthepresentationofpro ductsorservices;

(iii)valueofanassociationwiththeproductofacelebrityorwell -knownfictional character.

(d)"industrial or commercial activities" includes the activities of

(i)enterprisesprovidingproductsorservices,inparticularthebu yingandsellingof suchproductsorservices,and

(ii)professionalsinprivatepractice,

whether or not the yeng age in such activities for profit;

(e)"presentationofproductsorservices" includes advertising;

(f) "trademark" includes marks relating ng to either goods or services and marks relating to both goods and services.

CivilRemedies

 $\label{eq:3.4} \textbf{3.} (1) Any person who is injured or is likely to be injured by an act of unfair competition may institute proceedings in the High Court$

(a) for an injunction to prevent the act of unfair competition or to provide the continuation of the act of unfair competition; or

(b) for the recovery of damages for injury suffered as a result of the unfair competition.

(2) The grant of an injunction under subsection (1) doe snot deprive a per son of any damages that may be awarded to him for injury suffered by him or likely to be suffered by him as the result of an act of unfair competition.

UnfairCompetition

4.—(1)Thefollowingareactsofunfaircompetition:

(a) any act or the rconduct by a person in the course of industrial or commercial activities that is contrary to honest practices, in particular any act or other conduct

(i)that causes, or is likely to cause, confusion with respect to another person's enterprise or ractivities and to the products or services offered by such person;

(ii) that damages, or is likely to damage, the good will or reputation of an other person's enterprise, whether or not the actor practice causes confusion;

(iii)thatmisleads,orislik elytomisleadthepublicwithrespecttoanenterpriseorits activities,inparticular,theproductsandservicesofferedbysuchenterprise;

(iv)that results in the disclosure, acquisition or use by others of secret information without the consent of the person law fully incontrol of that information (here in a fter referred to as the "rightful holder") and in a manner contrary to honest commercial practices;

(b) any actor other conduct that consists of, or results in a number of the second second

(i)bya competentauthority,or

(ii) by other persons as a result of the improper disclosure by a competent authority;

ofsecrettestsorotherdataconcerningpharmaceuticaloragriculturalchemicalproductsthat utilisenewchemicalentitiestheoriginationof whichrequiresconsiderableeffortandwhich datahavebeensubmittedtothecompetentauthorityforthepurposeofobtainingapprovalof themarketingofsuchproducts;

(c) any false or unjustifiable allegation, in the course of industrial or commercial activities, that discredits, or is likely to discredit, another person's enterprise or the activities, products or services of fered by such enterprise.

(2)Wheresecrettestsorotherdatareferredtoinsubsection(1) (b)aresubmittedtoa competentaut horityforthepurposeofobtainingapprovalofthemarketingorpharmaceutical oragriculturalproductsthatutilisenewchemicalentitiestowhichthesecrettestsorother datarelate, suchinformationshallnotbedisclosed by the competentauthority nless

(a)thedisclosureisnecessarytoprotectthepublic, and

(b) steps are taken to protect the tests and data again stunfair commercial use.

(3) Any office rof the competent authority who contraveness ubsection (2) is guilty of an offence and is li able on summary conviction to a fine of \$10000 or to imprison ment for a term of 2 years or to both such fine and imprisonment.

(4) The prosecution of a criminal charge against a person pursuant to this section does not affect the institution of civil proceedings in the High Court against that person.

DamagetoGood will or Reputation

6.Forthepurposes of section 4(1) (*a*)(ii), damage to a person's good will or reputation may, in particular, result from the dilution of the good will or reputation attached to any of the following:

(a)atrademark,whetherregisteredornot;

(b)atradename;

(c) abusiness identifier other than a trademark or tradename;

(d)theappearanceofaproduct;

(e)the presentation of products or services;

(f)acelebrityorawell -knownfict ionalcharacter.

MisleadingthePublic

7.Forthepurposesofsection4(l) (*a*)(iii),misleadingthepublicmayariseoutofan advertisementorpromotionandmay,inparticular,occurwithrespectofanyofthefollowing;

(a)themanufacturingprocessof aproduct;

(b) the suitability of a productor service for a particular purpose;

(c) the quality or quantity or other characteristics of products or services;

(d)thegeographicaloriginofproductsorservices;

(e) the conditions on which products of ervices are offered or provided; or

(f) the price of products or services or the manner in which it is calculated.

SecretInformation

 $\label{eq:section4} \textbf{8.} (1) For the purposes of section 4 (l) \qquad (a) (iv), disclosure, acquisition or use of secret information by other swithout the consent of the right full holder may, in particular, result from$

(a)industrialorcommercialespionage;

(*b*)breachofcontract;

(c)breachofconfidence;

(d)inducement to commit any of the acts referred to in paragraphs (a) to (c);

(e) acquisitio nofatradesecret by a third party who knew, or was grossly negligent in failing to know, that an actreferred to in paragraphs (a) to (d) was involved in or would result from the acquisition.

(2)ForthepurposesofthisAct,informationshallbeconsi dered"secretinformation"if

(*a*)itisnot,asabodyorinthepreciseconfigurationandassemblyofitscomponents, generallyknownamongorreadilyaccessibletopersonsthatnormallywouldhaveknowledge oforaccesstothekindofinformationinque stion;

(b)ithas commercial value because it is a secret; and

(c) the right fulholder has taken responsible steps under the circumstances to keep it secret.

9.Forthepurposesofsection4(1) (c),discreditinganenterprise mayariseoutofan advertisementorpromotionandmay,inparticular,occurwithrespecttoanyofthefollowing:

(a) themanufacturingprocessofaproduct;

(b) the suitability of a productor service for a particular purpose;

(c)thequalityorquan tityorothercharacteristicsofproductsorservices;

(d) the conditions on which products or services are offered or provided;

(e) the price of products or services or the manner in which it is calculated.

Saving
